Yesterday I attended along with other members of the Italian community the inaugural Remembrance Day Service at Club Garibaldi. This special function was organised to remember and honour members' forebears.

Members were asked to find and send in photographs of their loved ones who had passed away. These photos were displayed/mounted on the walls of the clubrooms.

Officiating at the memorial service was Monsignor Gerry Burns, the Wellington Archdiocese Vicar-General who led the service with Fr Giosue Busti, Deputy Head of Mission at the Apostolic Nunciature (Embassy of the Holy See in attendance).

Paul Elenio welcomed everyone. Lina Volpicelli lit a special candle of remembrance. There were readings by David Monastra, with prayers of the faithful read by Maria Elenio. The Italian choir along with Frank Basile led those attending to sing 'Make Me A Channel of your Peace'. This hymn is based on the prayer of St Francis of Assisi, the Patron Saint of Italy.

Those in attendance were asked to take a flower from a special basket of blooms to place next to their loved ones and those of friends displayed on the boards.

Vic Criscillo read out this poem:

"Softly the petals of our memories fall. Gently we gather and treasure them all. Unseen, unheard you will always be near, Always loved. Always be missed. Never forgotten."

As part of the service "The Prayer" by Andrea Bocelli was played and gave people time to reflect on the loved ones. It was very moving.

Following the liturgy, we all enjoyed tea and coffee and some Italian treats.
