Paul Elenio, author of the book "Alla Fine del Mondo' (published by the Club and the Petone Settlers Museum) has been working on a second edition. Some of you may have been involved already, by giving of your time. The second edition is planned to be launched at the beginning of next year and Paul has included new chapters on the lives and conditions of immigrants of the country they left behind, Italy, and the country they came to, New Zealand. The chapter on Club Garibaldi has also been updated and a new chapter written about those Italians who were forced to work in market gardens which provided food for New Zealand and American troops in the Second World War. The cost of printing the book is \$12,000 for 750 copies and any contribution you make will assist the Club with this.
