### MISSING FISHERMEN – ARRIVE SAFELY AT PICTON

The anxiety which was felt yesterday for the safety of a fishing party from Island Bay was allayed last evening, on receipt of a telegram, stating that the launch had arrived safely at Picton. At 4 o'clock on Sunday morning the launch 'Stromboli' left the Bay, and went out into Cook Strait for a distance of nine miles, in company with six or seven other boats. When the fog came on later all the boats made a start for home, and all reached the Bay in due course with the exception of the 'Stromboli', which was manned by four men – Vince Barnao, Joe Barnao, Vincenzo Barnao and Giovanni Ziino. The thick fog completely enveloped the launch, and the fishermen must have lost their bearings. It was too foggy yesterday to go in search of the missing men, and news of their safe arrival on the other side of the Strait was received before anything could be done.

## SUNDAY CLUB DAY – CHANGE OF TIME


Please note that the time for Club Day on Sundays has changed. From the beginning of April 2012, the club will be open from 2pm to 7pm.
