As you know during the WW2, fifty Italian New Zealanders were incarcerated on Somes Island for a number of years. These were men identified by the Police and other authorities as being in category 1 of risk as "enemy aliens".

The story of the men features in the club's historical publication, Alla Fine Del Mondo (To the Ends of the Earth).

In 1995 the club recognised the detention of these men by installing a memorial seat at one of the highest points on Somes Island. The memorial seat, built with the skills of club members, was blessed by Cardinal Tom Williams and a large number of members attended the ceremony.

Club Garibaldi is marking 25 years since that important event and club members are invited to come on the trip to Somes Island for a short memorial service. More in this newsletter.



Somes Island Visit – Sunday 22 March 2020

The memorial seat on Somes Island marks for future generations the fact that 38 men of Italian origin spent some years incarcerated there as “enemy aliens”.

The island in the middle of Wellington Harbour was “home” for these men selected to be isolated and away from their families because of questions about their allegiances during the Second World War.

In 1995 a group of club members, including family of men held on the island, spent an afternoon on Somes (Matiu) and witnessed the blessing of the memorial seat by Cardinal Tom Williams, the then Archbishop of Wellington.

In a way the seat acts as a memorial to the few Italian migrants who were expert terrazzo layers. Led by long time club member Felice Benvenuti the small group crafted the seat for this special occasion in 1995.

Twenty-five years later we celebrate the talents of Felice and men like Giovanni Gasparini and others who were skilled in terrazzo and marble stonemasonry. Their most prominent work can be seen on the floor of the Wellington Railway Station and at the Settler’s Museum on the Petone waterfront, venue for the Alla Fine Del Mondo exhibition from 1995.

Felice was a former vice-president of the club and a regular when playing indoor bowls and cards was a Sunday afternoon event at the club. He died on 4 August 2019 at the age of 91. He had been married to Shirley for 65 years.



Labour weekend in Nelson – Email from Club Italia

Greetings Linda and all

For some time now we have been talking about our 25th anniversary celebrations and as it's not too far away now we need to be organised.

This is undoubtedly a significant milestone for both clubs and is the only event we have on our calendar that brings our two communities together. That it has been sustained for so long tells you just how important it's been for both clubs.

We have tentatively set aside Labour weekend the 24/25/26 October and the loose plan (at this stage) is to have a football match on Saturday the 24th followed by a Pizza party at the club in the evening.

If not, we can still have a fantastic celebration - but save ourselves a lot of unnecessary work.

I'd like to know by the end of March if the two-day event is confirmed, so please come back to me within the next 4 weeks. Once we know where we are headed, we can put together an activity plan for the weekend and work through potential funding. At this stage we're thinking;

- *Fully subsidised pizza night & gelato*
 - *Self-funding day activity Sunday (but discounted from suppliers)*
 - *Part subsidised dinner Sunday with some wine included plus complimentary player gifts and live music*
- I've copied Lisa and Francis who volunteered to organise the weekend together with committee support as necessary.*
