“Origins Italy”

A fantastic opportunity is being offered by the ITA (Italian Trade Agency) in Rome and the MIB (international School of high Management Training, based in Trieste). They are offering a scholarship to attend a management course for young Italian descendants of second and third generation Italians who live in countries outside of Europe. The course is intended for people who hold a degree or diploma of any kind, or those who have had some experience in the entrepreneurial and managerial field.

The aim is to: – Foster **collaboration between local companies and Italian emigrants** all over the world; **Strengthen the cultural and professional ties** between the descendants of emigrants and their land of origin; Help participants **develop new managerial and international business skills** through classroom learning, seminars, workshops and in-company experiences. The participants will have the chance to rediscover the culture, history and language of their forefathers and **strengthen their own identity**, while exploring new entrepreneurial and managerial experiences in collaboration with important local companies

The **course lasts 4 months (13 July 2015 – 14 November 2015)** and is taught **in English**.

Andrea di Robilant in Wellington 26 February 2015 for one event



Andrea di Robilant, Italian journalist, historian and author of *Chasing the Rose*, is coming to Wellington direct from the Perth International Arts Festival for a very special event.

In his 2008 biography (*Lucia: A Venetian life in the age of Napoleon*) of the great Italian lady Lucia Mocenigo, Andrea di Robilant described a pink rose that grows wild on the family's former country estate. Could this unnamed rose possibly be the long-lost Rose Bichonne, a China rose that nineteenth-century growers cultivated but which had apparently disappeared since?

In *Chasing the Rose*, he recounts the enthralling search for the identity of this rose, taking us back in time to Josephine Bonaparte and into some of the most delightful rose gardens in Europe today.

Heritage Roses NZ Inc, in partnership with NZ Book Council and Old St Paul's, presents Andrea di Robilant telling the story of his quest in Old St Paul's on Thursday 26th February.
