This year one of the big challenges we have faced is the renewal of our liquor licence. In 2012, the Liquor Licence laws changed and as a result of that change, Friendly Societies are unable to hold a liquor licence. We have options available to us, and your Executive are dealing with this at present. We will advise the outcome in due course. In the meantime, our current licence is valid till 19 March 2016.

Over the past year, we held a New Year Eve party; a mid-year Club dinner (in which we hosted the AC Milan soccer scouts); and the Cardinal celebrated Italian mass for us with a shared lunch – all these events were very successful – we had very close to, and in some cases, over 100 people attend these functions. Our usual annual events, i.e. Italian Day celebration, picnic etc...were also highly successful. We also hosted two book launches, and they too were great.

Our last event for the year is coming up on 7 November – when we will be hosting Club Italia, Nelson for the annual soccer match. This year is the 20th game (even though the 21st year – one year we had no game) and we plan to celebrate with a big party. We have approx 30 players and supporters coming from Nelson, so we hope to get Te Whaea park packed with Wellington supporters, and the Club full for the evening function.
