Children's Italian Lessons

The Executive has agreed to support the learning of Italian for the children of our members who are **aged between 7 and 16 years old**. This is in association with the Circolo Italiano teacher—led programme.

For the sake of clarity, given possible future changes in the Club's financial circumstances (*e.g. the purchase of alternative premises and associated costs*) or changes to the Club's Executive Committee (*who may have other priorities*) the following has been **agreed** by the Executive:

The Club will meet the Circolo Italiano tuition cost of a child of a Club Garibaldi parent who is a current member of the Club for the 2026 academic year, subject to the following restrictions.

To qualify:

- The relationship between the child and its parent does not extend to a grandparent for the purposes
 of this concession; and the child must attend at least 50% of the available Italian language classes on
 offer each term.
- The fee shall be paid in instalments at the end of each term by Club Garibaldi; and this should be regarded as a pilot scheme which will be subject to annual review by the Club before the operating year's end to enable the Circolo to advertise its new classes in good time.

Note: There will be limited spaces available due to the tutor- child ratio.



Marco Costa – taekwondo champion

We asked club secretary Marco to write about his sport and his recent international successes.

I began training in Taekwondo in 2007. As a kid, I always wanted to learn a martial art, and my club in Berhampore was the first one my parents took me to—and I've never left since!

I earned my 1st Dan black belt in 2015 and my 2nd Dan in 2021. From the beginning, I've competed in various tournaments, including the Wellington Regionals and the New Zealand Nationals, where I've medalled in events such as sparring, power breaking, and specialty (flying high kicks).

My first international tournament was in 2018, where I won a silver medal at the Oceania Cham pionships for team specialty. I was set to compete at the World Cup in Sydney that same year, but two days before the event, I broke my ankle and leg.

Due to that injury—and later COVID-19—I couldn't return to the international stage until 2024, when I competed at the World Cup in Mar del Plata, Argentina, narrowly missing out on a medal with a 4th place finish in individual male power breaking.



At the start of this year, I successfully trialled for the New Zealand team to compete at the Taekwondo World Championships in Poreč, Croatia from 8-11 October.

Unlike the World Cup, the World Championships have limited spots, and you truly represent your country. Preparing for this meant training seven days a week—four days of Taekwondo and three days at the gym—plus flying to Auckland every second month for team sessions. As Taekwondo is an amateur sport, everything is self-funded, so fundraising was a big part of the journey.



New Zealand sent a team of over 50 competitors, and with coaches and supporters, we were more than 100 strong. The tournament featured 1473 athletes from 57 countries. Historically, New Zealand has performed well at the World Championships, producing many world champions and even ranking as the best overall country in Wellington (2011) and Jesolo, Italy (2015). Powerhouses like Argentina, Poland, Ireland, Romania, and Italy are always strong contenders. Italy, for example, has Silvia Farigu, an 11-time world champion! I even got to meet some of the Italian team and practise my Italian as well as trade shirts with one of them.

I competed in the team male power breaking event, placing 5th, just missing out on a medal playoff. Overall, New Zealand placed 8th as a country.

Looking forward, my next goals are to compete at the World Cup in Spain next year and then at the World Championships in Paraguay in 2027.
