A little bit about me and my family. I was born in Masterton and have a sister Brigida and two brothers Joe and Vince. I have lived in Palmerston North and Rotorua. When I shifted to Wellington I managed some of the ANZ Branches from Kilbirnie to Johnsonville. The Basile name is well known in the wider Italian Community, and I was always asked who my father was from customers when they found out I was Italian, and my surname was Basile. Many of the Italians who came into the Branch knew Dad and told me stories about him in his younger days.

My Nonno and Nonna were Giuseppe and Brigida Basile who lived at 38 Trent Street, Island Bay. I have very special memories of them growing up and our family visiting them regularly. Afterwards we visited our relatives especially my aunties Giuseppina Mollo and Maria Costa and my cousins who lived close by.

My mother's family lived in Clyde Street. My grandmother Lily Ann Cochrane was blind, and she knew us by touching our faces when we visited. I never knew my mother's father as he died before I was born.

My father Mariano (Mario) was married to Thelma. Mum wasn't Italian but was very supportive of Dad's Italian Culture. One example being Dad using the copper at home to make tomato puree for our pasta in the beer bottles and cooking all our favourite Italian Food. He was a fisherman in Island Bay before he married Mum and used to cook for the fisherman in his teenage years. When they shifted to Masterton, they owned a Fish and Chip shop, and I remember Dad out the back filleting the fish. They spent long hours working in the shop.

Being Italian I think is family, generosity with food and getting together and "to never leave the table unless all the food is eaten".

As you are all aware the Club was established on 31 December 1883. In our Constitution one of the objectives (2b) is "to encourage the use of the Italian Language and to promote and enhance all aspects of Italian culture". I want to keep focused on this during my time as your President.

I went to Circolo for a few years to learn the Italian language. I tried my best, but it helps to have someone to talk to regularly to become fluent. If I read Italian I can understand a bit. Maybe your goal could be to help me.

Finally, this Club belongs to you the members. There have been many Presidents Trustees, Executives and Volunteers who have worked so hard since 1883 to make this Club so special. I acknowledge all their efforts. I won't take for granted the privilege of being the President of Club Garibaldi. Roberto Rossellini Retrospective – Rialto Film Channel


Rialto Channel in November will be showcasing a beautifully curated retrospective on Roberto Rossellini, a pivotal figure in world cinema and a founding voice in Italian Neorealism.

Highlights in the series include:

- Rome, Open City (1945) a seminal film shot during the Nazi retreat; the cornerstone of Neorealism.
- Paisan (1946) an episodic portrait of war and human connection during Italy's liberation.
- Germany, Year Zero (1948) filmed amid post-Nazi Berlin's ruins; stark and devastating.
- Stromboli (1950) starring Ingrid Bergman, grappling with spiritual isolation and resilience.
- Journey to Italy (1954) often cited as a precursor to modernist cinema.
- The Flowers of St. Francis (1950) poetic simplicity in storytelling and spirituality.
- The films are introduced with new contextual material and presented in newly restored versions where available.
