ANNUAL BLESSING OF THE BOATS

Island Bay - traditionally a fishing stronghold in Wellington - will once again, host the annual Blessing of the Boats during the Island Bay Festival on Sunday, 25 February 2009 at 2.30 pm.

The following is a little history of its origins. The blessing of fishing boats is a tradition in Italy that goes back centuries. In southern Italy, the blessing would be undertaken by the local priest at the start of spring. The boats, many of which were named after saints, were decorated in flags and bunting, would file past to have holy water sprinkled on them while the priest recited prayers and made the sign of the cross. The blessing was part of the religious belief that if the boats received the grace of God, they and the fishermen would be protected from the elements and would also reap the bounty of the sea.

Many of Island Bay's Italian immigrants came from the fishing villages of Massalubrense and Puolo in the Gulf of Naples, and the island of Stromboli, near Sicily. Today all sea craft and vessels are welcome to take part in this special ceremony.

A BIT OF TRIVIA

ANSA: Imperia, December 23, 2008

A 101-year-old Italian man, Giuseppe Rebaudi, a retired surgeon, who married his 98-year-old French sweetheart last summer after more than 50 years together has died after six months of marriage, a Genoa newspaper has reported.

Giuseppe met his future wife, Sylvie Basain, in Marseille in 1952. They were together for 56 years before she persuaded him to become man and wife. Their wedding on the Ligurian Riviera on June 26 attracted a lot of media attention.

Basain, a former employee of the French newspaper Nice Matin, told reporters: "We've only been together for 50 years. Marriage is not a step to be taken lightly".

Rebaudi said: "I'd never thought about tying the knot but Sylvie convinced me, even though it's a bit late".

LEONARDO DA VINCI MACHINES EXHIBITION – TOUR IN ITALIAN LANGUAGE

An Italian language tour took place at the Leonardo da Vinci Machines Exhibition on the 13th of December, at the New Zealand Fine Arts Academy in Wellington.

The organisers, Letizia Columbano and Luca Quaglia lead tour participants into Italian culture of the life and time of this great genius.

Members and students from the Circolo Italiano, Club Garibaldi, the Circolo Sardo Domus De Janas and Italian students from Victoria University joined the tour.

The machines exhibition is divided into four themes: flight, mechanics, war and hydraulics.

The interactive models - crafted by Florentine artisans (Tecknoart Group) to scale - follow the material used during Leonardo's time: wood, cotton, brass, iron and chords. They are true replica models taken from the Leonardo's code pages.

The organizers selected several machines to focus on: *Aerial Screw, Crossbow car, Locking system, Arched bridge, Armoured Tank* and *Archimedes Screw.*

Luca Quaglia explained in fine details the use of these machines (some of them invented by Leonardo but never applied in practical way). These are simple but great ideas that we take for granted in our every day life.

The tour has dedicated attention to not only the machines but also to the historical, political and artistic picture during the time in which Leonardo lived (1452-1519).

Letizia Columbano gave a 'taste' of the political situation in Tuscany and the rest of the Italian peninsula. She outlined the huge influences in Leonardo's life, including his experiences under Master Verrocchio's studio (the intellectual centre in Florence), working at the Sforza Court in Milan, the period in Venice, the time working in Rome and the eternal rivalry with Michelangelo.

Letizia noted Leonardo's acute observations of nature, the everlasting curiosity for everything and on everything. The perfection and dedication toward each discipline: from painting to poetry, from engineering to medicine, from music to cuisine have made Leonardo the *Universal Genius* by excellence.

The tour ended with a mix of questions and happy discussions over afternoon tea at Club Garibaldi with Panettone (homage to the Sforza Court in Milan), Panforte (homage to Tuscany) and a cup of coffee.

A very warm thank you to Luca and to all those who participated and helped to make this special event a success.
