## Zino 'over the moon'

### ■ INDOOR BOWLS SAM WORTHINGTON

JOSEPH ZINO is walking home from work with a spring in his step after completing a breakthrough season of indoor bowls.

The 34-year-old grocery manager bowed out as runner-up in Wellington's interclub champion of champions final on Monday night - but that could not put a dampener on a near-perfect year.

Zino skipped his father, John, Richard Corry and Denice Clarkson to the national indoor fours title in

Timaru in June before landing the big one - the New Zealand indoor champion of champions singles title in Dunedin this month.

"These are two massive breakthroughs," a chuffed Zino said. "I'm 34 and I've been bowling since I was seven or eight. I'm over the moon, really happy."

Zino is now aiming to crack the North Island and New Zealand indoor representative teams next year.

"That's something to strive for next season, it's a definite ambition, yes. You can't expect to win a national title

every year but I think it's just keeping your consistency, keeping your name up there in tournaments, that's what it comes down to."

Zino plays his outdoor bowls at the Island Bay club but, despite the indoor game receiving less recognition, he prefers the comfort of the carpet.

"For me, my outdoor is quite recreational and it's enjoyable but I'm no great shakes. I target the indoor."

Wellington's outdoor bowls season gets under way on October 3 with the first round of interclub.

## A BIT OF TRIVIA

(ANSA) - Squillace, July 24

An amateur scuba diver has discovered what may be the ruins of an ancient city off the coast of Calabria. Alessandro Ciliberto, an architect with a passion for scuba diving, discovered a group of stone blocks around 3-4 metres beneath the water while he was diving 15 metres from the shore near the town of Squillace on Calabria's east coast.

"Standing out against the sandy seabed there was a dark-coloured form, around two metres in length and a metre and a half wide which seemed to be man-made," Ciliberto said. "I then found a white-coloured stand half a metre high, and further on, a pair of stone blocks". The Squillace Town Council said it was possible that the ruins belonged to the ancient seaside city of Scyllium, which was founded when Southern Italy was a Greek colony. The town became a Roman colony in 124 BC and was the birthplace of 6<sup>th</sup> century Roman writer and statesman Cassiodorus, who claimed that it's founder was the legendary Greek king, Ulysses. Ruins from the city have previously been found in the nearby town of Roccella di Borgia.
